#### **MESSAGE FROM THE BOARD**

Elsewhere in this edition, you will see details of the upcoming Annual General Meeting (AGM) for MPCA. It will be held on October 20 at the Hall. As the Province of Alberta has ended the opportunity to either delay holding an AGM or to hold it in some virtual format, we are required to conduct this meeting before October 31. That date is set out in our Bylaws. You can be assured that we will follow all applicable safety and health guidelines set out for COVID-19. However, we understand that some members might not feel comfortable attending this meeting, and we respect your decision.

At some point in the near future, we will be considering possible amendments to the Bylaws. Such amendments might include the option for virtual meetings. However, under section 15 of the Societies Act, Bylaws can only be amended by a Special Resolution of the Society. Further, the amendments do not take effect until they have been registered with the government, and the Registrar does have the option to refuse to register amendments. Therefore, it is not possible to have these amendments in place this year. We are pleased to announce that Johanna Plant Donnelly has agreed to take on the role of Grants Coordinator for MPCA. Johanna and her family are in the final stages of completing the construction of their new home in the community. It is very encouraging to see new families moving into MPCA and getting involved in our activities. Johanna has already been reviewing some possible grants being provided to assist communities as they seek to reopen after closures imposed due to COVID-19.

## **Are We There Yet?**

#### Tell us a little history about John Lapointe

Born with a love for being 'hands on', I love tackling almost any type of job. As early as age 13, I shingled my parents' garage roof solo. Arriving in Alberta at 22, I was working as a chem/microbio lab tech. After being laid off, I decided to pursue a trade where I could continue using my hands, explore some creativity, and problem solve. half on my own, and I haven't looked back.

### What does a typical day look like now that you run your own business?

It might start with sketching a design for a potential customer, then selecting and pricing out material. Daily, I'm likely learning something a bit different (must be a jack of all trades), and of course, fabricating.

#### How long have you been fabricating?

About 12 years now total, less than 2 months trying to make it work on my own as Mr. Fusion Welding.

#### Tell us about the dogs in your life.

Currently, I have two dogs – Walter, 4 years, and Smudge, 15 years. At a time, we've had four dogs in the house. Roxie and Beasley unfortunately passed away, and the paw prints on the gates are slightly enlarged imprints taken from Roxie and Beasley, respectively. These gates are a way for me to honour and remember my friends.

### When do you usually show up at The Park?

I'm pretty random with my dog park appearances. I like coming when the sun is low in the sky, usually during evenings. I've been coming to the park since I moved to Mt. Pleasant in 2015.

### Starting October 1, remember to tag your extra garbage bags

Starting October 1, if you have an extra bag of garbage that won't fit in your City black cart, you'll need to buy a garbage tag. Tags are \$3 each and available at participating convenience and grocery stores or online. See the full list at calgary.ca/garbagetag.

#### How to use garbage tags:

- 1. Fill your black cart first.
- 2. Place extra garbage in a bag and wrap a tag around the knot on top of the bag.
- 3. On collection day, set the bag 0.5 metres (2 feet) from your black cart.

We encourage everyone to look at what you are buying and throwing away to find ways to reduce waste. Sorting materials correctly helps maximize the use of all three carts (blue, green, black).

This will help to ensure that you are taking all the necessary steps to operate your garage or yard sale in a way that supports your community's health and wellbeing.

### You have the Power!

A great way to reduce the overall environmental footprint for both your own home and the community as a whole is to generate your own energy. Micro-Generation Solar Photovoltaics (PV) involves the installation of solar panels directly on the roof of your homes, garages, and even some of our community buildings, which then generates green energy that can be used on-site or fed back into the grid. Generating your own electricity can save (or even earn!) you money by reducing the amount of energy you consume from the grid and can make your home more resilient to unplanned outages.

How do you find out if solar is right for you? Check out the City of Calgary's Solar Potential Map (https:// maps.calgary.ca/SolarPotential/), which acts as a starting point to show the viability of solar as an energy source for any property in the city! If you find you have a high solar potential and want to pursue it further, the City also has plenty of resources around financing and how to navigate the permitting and approval process (https://www.calgary.ca/cs/iis/solar-panel/solar-energy. html?redirect=/solar).

Our October book will be Washington Black by Esi Edugyan. Eleven-year-old George Washington Black—or Wash—a field slave on a Barbados sugar plantation, is initially terrified when he is chosen as the manservant of his master's brother. To his surprise, however, the eccentric Christopher Wilde turns out to be a naturalist, explorer, inventor, and abolitionist. Soon Wash is initiated into a world where a flying machine can carry a man across the sky, where even a boy born in chains may embrace a life of dignity and meaning, and where two people, separated by an impossible divide, can begin to see each other as human. But when a man is killed and a bounty is placed on Wash's head, they must abandon everything and flee together. Over the course of their travels, what brings Wash and Christopher together will tear them apart, propelling Wash ever farther across the globe in search of his true self. Spanning the Caribbean to the frozen Far North, London to Morocco, Washington Black is a story of self-invention and betraval, of love and redemption, and of a world destroyed and made whole again.

As we approach opening day, here are some Park Rules to follow closely:

- Dogs must have and wear a current City of Calgary license
- Dogs must not me left unattended
- Dogs must be under control at all times. No aggressive, sick or overly loud dogs are allowed.
- Dog owners must pick up and dispose of feces immediately in an appropriate manner. Failure to comply will result in a \$250 fine.
- Children must be supervised at all times
- No glass containers allowed
- Two dogs per person maximum

St. Joseph Park is a much anticipated and supported community space. When it's complete, it will be a great place to bring your dog, meet new people, and spend some time socializing. Be mindful to do so safely with some distance, with safety of others top of mind.

A few parting words – while most people love our dogs, others prefer a quieter lifestyle. We all want to respect each other and their wishes, and I ask we all respect our neighbours. And let's keep the park clean while we're at it!
