DOLLARS & SENSE How To Avoid Ticketmaster Lookalike Scams

Concerts are back! Bands are touring again, and ticket spending is back to pre-COVID-19 levels. This fact hasn't gone unnoticed by scammers, though. Recent reports to BBB Scam Tracker indicate that con artists are preying on concertgoers by pretending to represent popular ticket seller Ticketmaster.

How the Scam Works

You are looking to buy tickets to an upcoming concert or need to transfer tickets for a show that was postponed due to COVID-19. You do an internet search for your question, which brings up results for Ticketmaster. You click through to the website, and everything looks normal.

The website prompts you to enter your personal information and a credit card number. However, as soon as you complete a transaction, you notice some suspicious activity. You might receive tickets with someone else's name on them, or you may never receive your tickets at all. In other cases, you get the tickets, but the site charges you a much higher rate than advertised.

Upon closer inspection, you realize you were not on the Ticketmaster site at all! It was a lookalike site with a similar name. When you call the customer service number, they are either unreachable, unhelpful, or downright aggressive.

One ticket buyer reported this experience: "They sent me two tickets with someone else's name on them, and they also charged me three times the amount [of] the ticket price. I have no way to get a refund and no customer service to contact (except by email) because they do not answer their phone."

How to Avoid Event Ticket Scams

Purchase from the venue. The safest way to purchase event tickets is to go directly through the venue, either in person or through their official website. The venue's website may point you to Ticketmaster or another provider to complete your purchase, but you can be sure of having the correct website URL.

Check out the seller. If you purchase from a third-party company, make sure that they are a reputable ticket vendor or reseller, not a ticket scalper. Check reviews on BBB.org.

Watch out for fake websites. Take a close look at the website's URL to ensure that there are no slight misspellings. Impostors like to make lookalike websites with domain names that are similar to well-known business names. This makes them hard to spot.

Use a safe payment method. Always make online purchases with your credit card. You can dispute fraudulent charges and have a better chance of getting your money back.

SAFE & SOUND Halloween Safety

The members of Calgary's Partners for Safety: Calgary's Child Magazine, AHS EMS, Calgary Police, Fire, 911, Bylaw, and Transit would like to remind parents and trick-or-treaters of some Halloween safety tips as October 31 approaches. Partners for Safety vehicles will be out patrolling communities on Halloween night to provide a visible safety resource for parents and trick-or-treaters.

Trick-or-Treaters

- Remember: All regular pedestrian rules still apply. Be sure to cross the road at marked crosswalks, or well-lit corners only. It is safest to work your way up one side of the street, and then cross once to the other side.
- Avoid houses that are not well lit. Do not accept rides from strangers or enter any home you feel is unsafe.
- Let your parents know where you are going to be at all times (route) and advise them if you will be late returning.

Parents

- Be certain that young trick-or-treaters are accompanied by an adult. Older children should stay in groups.
- Pre-determine boundaries to trick-or-treat within and establish a firm time to return home.

• Advise children not to eat anything until they return home. Dispose of any items that appear to have been tampered with, or that are not properly wrapped.

Costumes

- Choose bright coloured costumes that are highly visible. Adding reflective tape to costumes further increases visibility.
- Consider sending your children with a flashlight for additional safety and increased visibility.
- When purchasing or making costumes, look for materials and accessories that are labeled flame-resistant.
- All costume accessories, such as sticks, rods, or wands, should be soft and flexible, with no sharp edges.
- Consider using hypoallergenic make-up kits instead of masks that may impair breathing, or vision.
- Be sure costumes are loose enough to be worn over warm clothing, but not so long that they become a tripping hazard. Costumes should not be longer than your child's ankles.
- Ensure your child is wearing adequate footwear that takes into consideration weather conditions and walking.

Building Trust After Betrayal

How do I trust myself since it feels like my instincts were so wrong? In the aftermath of a betrayal, looking inward and identifying what we need in order to regain trust, starts with learning to trust ourselves. This is where wisdom is gained. Trusting ourselves after a betrayal is a skill we have to practice until we get strong enough to make empowered decisions based on the connection to our trained instinct, rather than impulsive reactions rooted in anxiety. Trusting ourselves can look like knowing what we need and operationalizing that by seeking honesty and accountability from our partner. Learning what healthy boundaries are and honing that sixth sense or gut instinct is key. This can be helpful even if we are not ready to trust our partner again. Only we have the power and control to decide our limits and who and what can exercise power over us.

For the betrayer, this is what rebuilding trust needs to look like, and what we will be looking for from you:

Empathy – Put yourself in your partner's shoes and try to imagine what the pain of betrayal feels like and how their world has been shattered to the core.

Time – Allowing your partner time. Feelings and memories do soften with the passage of time.

Reciprocity – There must be a give and take within the relationship moving forward. Your partner's emotional bank account is starting at a deficit.

Action – Saying "I'm sorry" is not enough, true remorse requires a change in behaviour. Seek professional help if you're not sure what this should look like.

Accountability – Full disclosure of the betrayal and taking ownership immediately when there is a lapse. In addition to doing what you say you are going to do, being on time, making that call if you're running late, etc.

Rigorous Honesty – When asked, come clean immediately, the lies are always worse than the action after trust has been broken.

Complete Transparency – No omissions if not asked directly, offering up information, sharing passwords for devices, etc.

Recovering from betrayal can be a daunting process. The trauma of betrayal is real and can cause some people to become stuck. There is help and hope. Please reach out to a trained professional to help you define your needs, learn to create healthy boundaries, and flex that innate gut instinct.
